ENVIRONMENTAL POLICY

The company's principal activity is the installation of Mechanical and Electrical Services to new and refurbished buildings, encompassing residential, commercial, public and industrial projects.

The Company is committed to legal compliance, continual improvement and prevention of pollution.

The Company will keep itself informed of all Legislation, Regulations and Codes of Practice on environmental matters that are relevant to its operations; make best endeavours to ensure that its personnel are aware of and adequately instructed in the requirements of legislation etc; and take all other reasonable actions, including correct vehicle maintenance with due regard to the environment and minimising waste to ensure compliance.

The Company will ensure that it is in compliance with all relevant environmental legislation and will take all reasonable precautions to prevent environmental damage and disruption or nuisance to the public on or adjoining its sites. It will at all times endeavour to keep clean and tidy its sites and any adjoining areas that may be affected by traffic to and from those sites and to avoid pollution of the air, ground or water by noise, fumes, dust or the disposal of materials.

In particular the Company will, wherever viable, use materials and products from sustainable sources and those that can be reused or recycled.

The Company will make every effort to conserve the use of materials and of energy and collect waste materials for re-cycling.

The Company will appoint a Director / Senior Manager to supervise the implementation and further development of its environmental policy.



Any environmental problems encountered in carrying out the works according to the clients' instructions will be brought to the attention of the Client, and of any competent authority, with a view to finding a satisfactory solution. The Company is, in particular, fully aware of the importance of archaeological remains as part of our national heritage and of their interest to those concerned of the history of the evolution of the built environment. A balance has to be struck between the needs of society today and in the future, and the demand for developments which require to be properly sited in order to be viable, in situations which may threaten the preservation of sites considered by some people to be of historical value. Archaeological sites are more likely to be in ownership of our clients rather than the Company. Their development will frequently be outside our control.

The Policy therefore is that each case has to be treated on its own merits, which should be researched as thoroughly as possible in order to achieve a result which may be a balance between meeting the needs of the consumer as fully as possible, whilst minimising the disturbance to the environment and archaeological remains.

The company will apply the principles of continuous improvement in respect of air, water, noise and light pollution from our premises and reduce any impacts from our operations on the environment and local community.
